Message from Tom

A huge well done to the girls that represented Team Wales in Luxembourg at the end of January. This meet was targeted deliberately because of the world class level of competition, it was an opportunity for our swimmers to compete in the same arena, and in the same races as Olympic champions. It was not a meet where we targeted times (the P1 squad is undergoing heavy training) but focused on the behaviours and processes that underpin excellent performance. Swimmers learn a lot about themselves when they are asked to perform in different environments, in different locations against different swimmers. It is not easy and it isn't straightforward.

My view is that the more we expose our P1 swimmers to these new challenges, the greater the gains will be. I am sure the three TD girls will have learnt from the competition and share their experiences with the rest of the squad.

The same is true for Dylan and Meg who competed in Aberdeen at an international para competition. Again, the competition was world class providing similar challenges for the TD swimmers. The focus was on 'racing hard' focusing on process and improving on race plans from heats to finals. Both swimmers achieved this, which confirms to me and the coaching team that the P1 squad is in the right place given the time in the cycle.

So, as we look forward to our up coming competitions, we will be looking for more of the same. To commit to the racing plans and to demonstrate positive attitudes and winning behaviours.







Committee News

Committee Meeting

The first committee meeting of the season was held on the 29th November at 17.30 in the Hanbury Suite, PALC. The main areas of discussion focused on feedback from the Swim Wales Annual General Meeting, Swim Wales club engagement session and audit. This year the club was chosen to pilot and provided feedback prior to the audit tool launch. The main feedback from the engagement meeting was the launch of Ein Clwb, a portal on Just Go to assist the executive committee in their duties. Changes in personnel at Swim Wales, training & development opportunities and Swim Wales role as a lobby agent for Clubs and Pool Partners when discussing funding with the Welsh Government.

Reflection on the Spooktacular Meet

After every gala we ask for feedback on how to improve future events. The number of spectators at the Spooktacular was raised as a concern as we were full to capacity. The meet planning committee is looking at a number of ways to monitor spectator numbers for the upcoming St David's Day Meet. Spectator tickets will be purchased online and limited to one ticket per swimmer. This will be monitored to see if this reduces overcrowding.

The St David's Meet is proving to be a popular event and for the first time the number of swimmer entries has exceeded capacity. It is always difficult when swimmers need to be scratched from events but we have limited pool time and space. The organising committee are trying to keep the number of exclusions to a minimum by maximising the day. Warm up will start at 7.30 and there will be two sessions finishing at 16.15. At present we do not have criteria in place when maximum capacity is reached. This will be addressed in the coming weeks to ensure parents are aware of the policy.

Torfaen Leisure Trust Meeting

The executive committee meets quarterly with the Torfaen Leisure Trust. (TLT) Issues discussed include transition from learning to swim to development. TLT are now identifying swimmers with talent and directing them to the club and this appears to be working well. We have had discussions about the purchase of a trophy cabinet to display the numerous awards won over the past years. This is proving costly for TLT and the club is looking at ways of funding this purchase. Pool maintenance has been discussed and the pool temperature at Fairwater has been top priority recently. TLT are working hard to resolve the issue. It appears that a sensitive pool thermometer is to blame requiring fine adjustment to stop swings in pool temperature.

The St David's Day meet is run in conjunction with TLT and the learn to swim classes will again have a swim meet. Any volunteers/officials who wish to remain after the TD meet are more than welcome.

Swim Wales Annual Awards

The glitz and glamour of the Swim Wales Annual Awards came to the Village Hotel, Cardiff on the 20th January 2024. All aquatic sports were represented alongside learn to swim and recreational swimming. The awards recognised a diverse range of individuals, clubs and partners across 23 categories. his event had in excess of 300 nominations and each award was shortlisted to just two nominees. So being nominated was an achievement in its own right.

Torfaen Dolphins had four nominations with Theodora Taylor winning Best Young Athlete award, Tom Croke collecting the Best Performance Coach award and the Club won Best Performance Club. Dylan Broom was nominated for Best Para swimmer but narrowly missed out of an award this year.

Torfaen Dolphins has a good record of winning awards at this event and that's all down to the hard work of coaches, parents and swimmers

We have been working hard with Torfaen Leisure Trust to recruit new members from their learn to swim programme. Just before Christmas 14 new members had trials with all starting in the Foundation squad in January. There are a further two swimmers currently on trial, with one transfer request pending.

There have been two new members joining the Performance squad alongside three moves from Transition Performance.
